- 3.1 T F In competition the coach must cock the shooters BB gun. (TL-p7,r)
- 3.2 T F Rifles shoot one bullet at a time. (TL-p7,r)
- 3.3 T F Your Master Eye is the eye that looks straight ahead. (TL-p7,r)
- 3.4 T F It is safe to carry a loaded gun in your car, at camp or in your home because we are supposed to treat every gun as if it were loaded. (TL-p7,r)
- 3.5 T F Rifle bullets can travel over three miles (.30-06). (TL-p7,r)
